Earlier in her career, she was an agent for Sotheby's and managed three offices for a national brand.

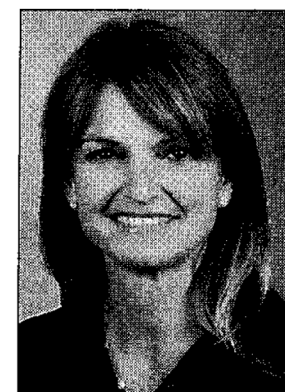
Fox also spent many years working for the Trump Organization, the Zeckendorfs, Marketing Directors Inc. and WCI Communities.
